General Paul D. Slack

Biography:

General Slack has a B.S. degree from the U.S. Naval Academy and an M.S. degree in Management Engineering from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Troy, New York. He currently offers a seminar addressing National Security Policy at the University of Utah. He also offered a seminar on the Military Industrial Complex and Tax Policy. He has lectured at the University of Hawaii in the business school addressing production management, principles of business and business statistics.

General Slack joined Iomega Corporation in June of 1986 after retiring from the U.S. Marine Corps as a Brigadier General. While on active duty in the Marine Corps, he served in a variety of staff and command positions. He commanded both the 5th and 9th Marine Expeditionary Brigades, served as Military Assistant to the Vice President of the United States, and concluded his career as the officer responsible for the Automation of Command and Control Systems in the Marine Corps.

While serving in the White House, he coordinated all intelligence information crossing the desk of the Vice President, attended Foreign Intelligence Committee meetings acting as secretary and served as liaison to the National Security Council for the Vice President.

As the Senior Vice President for Corporation Operations at Iomega, his responsibilities involved management of the Human Resources Department, Corporate Information Systems, Communications, Publications, Facilities, Legal Department, and Secretary of the Corporation.

General Slack was active in the Utah Manufacturers Association and served on the Governor's Utah Partnership for Educational and Economic Development Committee as well as the Governor's Information Technology Development Task Force. He has participated in a number of workshops and seminars addressing statewide education issues and the problems of recruiting and retaining "high tech personnel."

General Slack served on the Board of Directors for the Armed Forces Communications and Electronic Association and as a Trustee for the Utah Information Technologies Association, as a member of the Advisory Board for the College of Social and Behavioral Science, University of Utah, and as a member of the Business Education/Administrative Systems Advisory Committee and Weber State University.
