**Biography:**

Mr. Bennett has taught in the MPA program since 2004. During that time, he has taught Environmental Law for Non-Lawyers, Administrative Law, and Constitutional Law. He graduated with a B.S. from the University of Utah in 1998. He majored in Political Science, minored in History, and earned an undergraduate certificate in Public Administration. After his undergraduate studies, he completed a joint MPA/JD at the University of Utah. After law school, he clerked for the Honorable Pamela T. Greenwood (Retired) at the Utah Court of Appeals. After his clerkship, he was hired as a Honors Program Attorney at the United States Department of the Interior in Washington, D.C. After three years at the Department of the Interior in both Washington, D.C. and Salt Lake City, Utah, he was hired by the United States Department of Justice, United States Attorney's Office for the District of Utah. Currently, Mr. Bennett is an Assistant United States Attorney, the Deputy Chief of the Civil Division, and the head of the Financial Litigation Unit. Mr. Bennett also prosecutes environmental crimes. In addition to his regular duties at the U.S. Attorney's Office, he has traveled to the Dominican Republic, Colombia, and Mexico to train prosecutors in those countries how to conduct trials in an accusatory judicial system.
